2021 Property Tax Bills have been released, due by January 25, 2022

Tax Commissioner Virgil M. Jones announced today that 2021 Property Tax bills have been released. Tax bills can immediately be accessed and printed on our website and payments can now be made online. Payment must be received by or USPS postmark by January 25, 2022.


During the week of November 22, 2022 a tax notice will be mailed to each property owner to the last mailing address provided by the property owner. Please allow sufficient time to receive a tax notice considering the current postal system, and it is the week of the Thanksgiving holiday. If you feel that you did not provide a new mailing address in time to receive your tax notice in the mail please print your tax notice online. You can also submit a change of address online for future notices.

Payments may be made by the following methods:

- In-person at our main office located at 106 Main St., Hinesville
- **By mail to:** Liberty County Tax Commissioner, 100 Main St. Suite 1545, Hinesville Ga.
- Online at <u>www.libertygatax.com</u>
- Place in one of three drop boxes:
 - 1. Located outside of the Liberty County Courthouse Annex at 106 Main St. Hinesville
 - 2. Located inside the lobby of the Liberty County Courthouse Annex
 - 3. Located inside the Liberty County Community Complex located at 9397 E Oglethorpe Hwy, Midway

For property owners with escrow accounts, tax information is sent to the mortgage companies that request the information; we are unable to know who has an escrow and who is responsible for paying your taxes. Therefore, the property owner is responsible to ensure taxes are paid by the due date.

A total of 27,147 tax bills totaling \$59,811,157.55 were calculated and are being issued. The chart below details this year's property tax revenue billed by the taxing authorities:
